EYFS Information

It has been lovely to see the children progressing and enjoying school. Our roleplay is a garage where the children can interact with the different tools. Outside we will have our home area and reading area. The children have enjoyed making their own food, making boats, dressing up as animals and exploring using playdough. PE will continue to take place on a Monday for the reception children and they have been working well as team with the class. The children are developing well with their phonics and it has been good to see them use what they have learnt throughout the day. WOW slips are used to share achievements with the class and can be used at home too. The children's learning journeys are available in class for you to have a look at if you wish to.

KS1 Information

On the last day before we broke up for half-term, the children got involved with cooking, arts and crafts and sports. This was a great way to end a fabulous half-term and it was good seeing the children getting creative outdoors. We are continuing our topic on 'Argh You Ready for an Adventure?' and we are investigating different boats and materials. We are also making our own boats to float using what we have learnt. In literacy the children have created their own stories based on the book 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' which you can see on our working wall. We are now learning about different instructions and poetry patterns. In PE our focus is throwing, dodging and catching. In mathematics we have been learning about addition and subtraction. We are now going to be learning about measures, multiplication and division. The children will continue to work with different resources and different representations. The children will continue to have different spelling activities every morning to practice and will be tested every Thursday. It has been a great first half term and I have been impressed with the children's work. I look forward to the next.
